


#### Is there member of your family (household) who is working abroad...?

Is there member of your family (household) who is studying abroad...?








### **Emigration experience - countries**

# Dimensions of the potential emigration stream




### **Methodological Notes**

- In order to reach more detailed conclusions, respondents were separated in groups.  $\checkmark$
- In the beginning were defined two main "screening" indications:
  - for eligibility of respondents those who intend to stay/travel abroad for at least one month.
  - for forming of universe of potential emigrants those who declare wish and inclination to stay and/or work abroad.
- Eligible respondents who don't declare wish and inclination to stay and/or work abroad, but only desire to travel formed the group of so called "tourists" or "guests".
- After that, respondents within "emigration universe" were divided into two main groups: "Longterm emigration" and "Short-term emigration", accordingly to declared period of stay abroad.
- Into Long-term external migration group were included all respondents who intend to stay abroad above one year. Those respondents were divided additionally into two subgroups – "settlers" and "labour emigration".
  - First subgroup ("settlers") includes respondents who declare wish to leave off Bulgaria and also respondents who declare that they prefer to live and work/study abroad.
  - Second subgroup (labour emigration) includes respondents who declare wish to work or study abroad for more than one year, but prefer to return and live in Bulgaria – they do not declare wish to live abroad.
- Into Short-term external migration group were included all respondents who intend to stay abroad **GALLUP** for up to one year and do not declare wish to live abroad. International



#### Probability to stay abroad above one month








### Declared periods of stay abroad





### Probable time of departure





### Main purposes of staying abroad




### Which of the following areas do you intend to work in abroad?






## Destinations of the potential emigration stream



### **Main destinations – first mentions**







# Estimations of amount of the potential emigration stream



#### Estimations of the factual emigration stream

#### **Methodological notes (1)**

- Calculations of the factual amount of the emigration stream are based on the recent data for the population of Republic of Bulgaria coming from Bulgarian National Statistical Institute (published 16.06.2006). Accordingly to those data population of Republic of Bulgaria in the age group of 15 60 years old is 4987 thousand people. One percent of present survey's sample is equal to 49 870 people.
- ✓ There must be noticed that present survey measures attitudes and intentions which are not necessary going to be realized.
- Generally, the universe of potential emigrants who most likely will generate factual emigration stream was defined as including people who prefer to live and work abroad or people who declare wish to work or study abroad, and in the same time declare high possibility to stay abroad for *period above one year*.
- ✓ That preliminary universe size is equal to 5.6% of the total sample or about 277,3 thousand people of the Republic of Bulgaria's population in age between 15 and 60 years old. The "settlers" are 3.1% (56% of the potential emigrants) and "labour emigrants" − 2.5% (44% of the potential emigrants).


#### **Methodological notes (2)**

- ✓ After that, in order to receive veracious, factual results were defined several compulsory conditions which potential emigrants should fit to:
  - Presence of some kind of preparation of documents needed for departure
  - Appropriate age (not older than 30) for those who declare wish to study abroad
  - Indication of at least one country where the potential emigrant wish stay in
  - Indication of intended general (at least) economic sphere for those who declare intention to work abroad
  - Knowledge (in any degree) of foreign languages spoken in countries where respondents intend to stay in
  - Declared high possibility for departure within next 5 years
- ✓ Respondents who didn't satisfy corresponding conditions were additionally excluded from the "emigration universe"
- ✓ Finally, emigration universe was evaluated on about 1% of total sample or about 47 900 people.
- ✓ Intervals in estimations are based on standard deviation assumed of +/- 4.5%.






## Presence of documents for departure preparation




#### Main sources for financing of departure




### **Comparison 2001 - 2006**



#### **Summary of Main findings (1)**

- ✓ Overall level of emigration attitudes and intentions is unchanged in comparison with
   2001 year, but there is change in the internal structure of emigration background.
- ✓ There is decrease in the share of Long-term emigrants and increase in the share of Short-term emigrants (in over 50%).
- ✓ Estimations of the expected factual emigration shows that around 48 000 people within Bulgarians between 15 and 60 years old have serious intentions and possibilities to work and stay abroad. That number is fairly lower than 2001 y. it's around 13% decrease in absolute numbers.



#### **Summary of Main findings (2)**

- ✓ On spontaneous level, almost ¼ of respondents decl are some kind of emigration attitudes, but subsequent analysis shows that only minor part of them have strong intentions and real possibilities to travel, live or work abroad
- ✓ There are no very significant changes regarding socio-demographic characterizations of the potential emigrants in comparison with 2001 y.
- ✓ Still men prevail over women, but it should be noticed that share of women is increased, especially within group of "labour emigration".
- ✓ Most of the potential emigrants are younger people (up to 40 years old) and mainly up to 30 years old.



#### **Summary of Main findings (3)**

- ✓ People with secondary education dominate within emigrants' universe, but there is increase within share of potential emigrants with lower education, due to strengthen presence of Roma.
- Increase of Roma's share is most visible in group of "settlers". Ethnic Bulgarians are more (in comparison with 2001) within group of "long-term labour emigrants" and it seems that they are lost some interest toward determinate setting up abroad as well as toward short-term emigration activities. Ethnic Turks seem lower interested toward long-term labour emigration, but seem more attracted toward short-term emigration.
- ✓ Most of the potential emigrants live in urban areas, especially in biggest cities, excluding Sofia. There is some increase of villagers' share within group of "short-term emigrants"

#### **Summary of Main findings (4)**

- ✓ About 34 000 people declare intention to work and live in European Union membercountries for more than one year.
- ✓ The most preferred destinations are Spain and Germany.

✓ There are some changes within potential emigrants' preferences. Some "traditional" destinations as North America (USA and Canada) are not so attractive already, as well as Germany (independently that Germany is still one of the top destinations). On other hand, there is increase in interest toward some European countries - Spain, UK, Italy.



#### **Summary of Main findings (5)**

- ✓ About ¼ of the potential emigrants plan to depart within one year, slightly over 40% in 2-3 years after that (i.e. 2008-2010 year) and around 1/3 in the more distant future.
- ✓ Decreasing of amount of emigrant stream in comparison with 2001 is bigger among those people who intend to depart within next 2–3 years, i.e. within people with strongest intention to leave.
- ✓ Dimensions of the declared emigration intentions and calculations of the expected factual emigration stream show that the Bulgarian emigrants are not imminent for EU labour market and for EU member-countries on overall.
